Established in 1997, Baruch College Campus High School (BCCHS) is the result of collaboration between New York City's Department of Education and Baruch College, The City University of New York. The student-faculty ratio is approximately 34:1. Admission is based upon middle school GPA and attendance records. 98% of BCCHS students matriculate at 4 year colleges.

Grading System

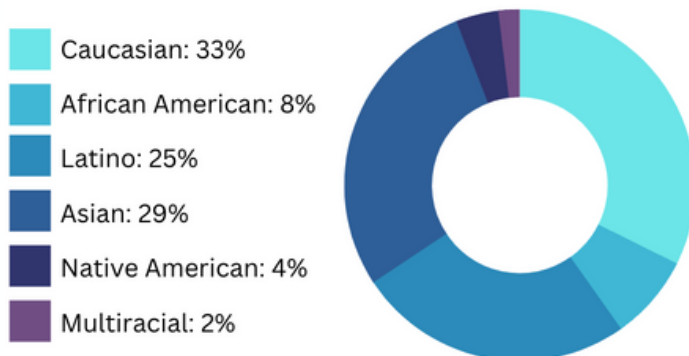
BCCHS does not rank its students. Grades are awarded on a 100 point scale. All courses are taught at an honors level. We are a term model school where grades are finalized in January and June. Students no longer receive academic credit for Advisory as of January 2019. The GPA is weighted for AP and university level classes only. They are weighted by multiplying the number grade equivalent by a factor of 1.1. Please note that students are limited to the number of AP classes available to them.

The minimum passing grade is a 65/D. BCCHS prioritizes service and independent reading. Students who complete 100 hours of community service receive a seal of service on their diploma. Many courses have a service learning component.

COVID-19

Due to the inherent challenges presented by COVID-19, the New York City Department of Education adapted a new grading policy where parents/guardians may choose to have any passing grade updated to a passing grade of “credit” (CR). Grades of “CR” will not be factored into students’ GPAs.

Standardized Testing

Our transcript does not report scores for SAT or AP exams. It is the student's responsibility to release these scores to colleges.

AP Classes

Some middle schools offer high school courses. These students are allowed to enroll in AP Environmental Science, AP Statistics, and AP Spanish.

Testing Profile

Scores reflecting each student's highest scores as of June 2022 are as follows:

AP: 100 of 119 (84%) of the class of 2023 will have taken at least one AP Exam by the time of graduation.

College Now

Based on our school size and programming limitations for AP courses, students have additional opportunities to take classes at Baruch College in: Business Fundamentals, Cultural Anthropology, Journalism, Psychology, and Personal Finance.

Co Curricular Activities & Community Involvement

BCCHS students are heavily involved in their community. These efforts include after-school tutorial and recreational programs, volunteering at non-profit organizations, translating for non-English speaking patients at local hospitals, and participating in the AIDS and Breast Cancer Prevention walks. Extra-curricular activities include: Athletic Teams, the Technology Team, Yearbook, Student Council, and the National Honor Society. Clubs include the American Red Cross Club, Black and Latino Student Union, Debate Club, Drama Club, Film Club, Gender Sexuality Alliance, Lorax, and UNICEF. Our school is partnered with Manhattan Class Company Theater and students have performed Shakespeare.
