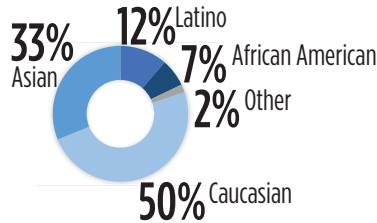

## SCHOOL PROFILE 2020-2021

### School and Community

Baruch College Campus High School (BCCHS) was established in 1997 as a collaboration between New York City's Department of Education and Baruch College, The City University of New York.

The 500-member student body is approximately:



Admission is based upon middle school GPA, ELA, Math test scores, and attendance records.

All students must complete 20 hours of community service annually and complete a Senior Exit Project.

99% BCCHS Students matriculate at four-year institutions.

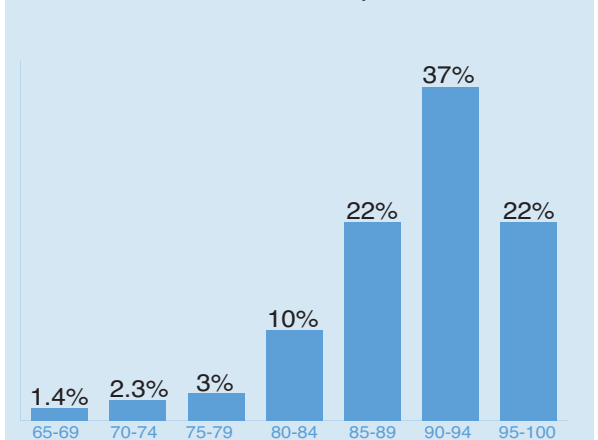


### Grading System

BCCHS does not rank its students. Grades are awarded on a 100 point scale. All courses are taught at an honors level. Advanced Placement, Regents, and College courses are marked on the transcript and weighted as follows: AP (1.1), College level (1.1) and Advanced Art (1.05). To align with NYC DOE Academic Policy, in 2018, we switched from annualized where grades are finalized in June to a term model where grades are finalized in January and June.

## Co-Curricular Activities and Community Involvement

BCCHS students are heavily involved in their community. These efforts include after-school tutorial and recreational programs, volunteering at non-profit organizations, translating for non-English speaking patients at local hospitals, and participating in the AIDS and Breast Cancer Prevention walks. Students can also participate in an internship in 11th or 12th grade. Extra-curricular activities include: athletic teams, yearbook, debate team, student council, and the National Honor Society. Clubs include the American Red Cross Club, the Club of Rock, the Drama Club, the Film Club, Gender & Sexuality Alliance, Environmental Club, and UNICEF. Our school is partnered with Manhattan Class Company Theater and students have performed Shakespeare, as well as completed Senior Exit monologues. BCCHS has 30+ clubs.

## BARUCH COLLEGE CAMPUS PROGRAMS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

**White House Science Fair:** BCCHS was the only school in NY State to receive the Lemelson-MIT InvenTeam Grant of \$10,000. The grant supported our students' invention for a detachable vacuum cleaner for subways that can be placed on passenger trains without interfering with train service. This work led to our students being invited to present their work to President Obama at the 2016 White House Science Fair. BCCHS students received the InvenTeam award in 2019 to design a solar powered washing machine.

**Intel School of Distinction in Mathematics:** BCCHS was honored as a finalist in 2015.

**US News and World Report:** Gold Medal School Award

**Black Board Award:** Excellence in Education

**BCCHS Partners:** Manhattan Class Company Theatre, CUNY College Now, Rock The Street Wall Street, Town Hall Theatre, Harvard University, Solar 1, King Movement, Jazz at Lincoln Center, Wise and Amazon Computer Science.

**First Choice:** BCCHS was reported by the Daily News as being number four amongst New York City students who listed it as their first choice school. Baruch accepted 110 students from approximately 7,000 applicants.

**Senior Mentor Program:** Senior Mentor Program matches every freshman at Baruch with a Senior Mentor. Seniors facilitate discussions on a range of topics such as: time-management, homework help and socializing in high school.
