## **JANUARY JUNIOR CHECKLIST**



• Continue to **research colleges**: Use Naviance and the college research listed read books, visit college websites, go to college fairs and information sessions

• Complete the FAFSA4caster and use the Net Price Calculators (available on every college's website) to estimate the costs for each school, and begin identifying ways to meet these costs with your families (see section 6 of this newsletter)

• Prepare for the SAT/ACT exams

• Register early for SAT/ACT taken outside of school (You do not have to register for the SAT exam that you take at the school)

• **Stay involved!** Take on leadership roles and get involved in clubs and community organizations.

• Keep your relationships with your teachers strong; remember, they will be writing your letters of recommendation

• Work hard and get good grades in all of your courses!!!

Available both online and in the **App Store**. Search "Khan Academy" for daily SAT practice questions. It also includes instant practice test scoring. They also provide free practice full-length tests, quizzes, tips, and strategies to help students prepare for the SAT exam. Students can also connect their College Board and Khan Academy accounts to track their progress!

#### **Union Test Prep**

Union Test Prep provides free practice tests, flashcards, and study guides to help students prepare for the ACT exam. Students can also see commonly asked questions and answers about the ACT examination as well.
