****UPCOMING DEADLINES****

NOV. 2ND: Complete CUNY applications and enter schools on Naviance.

NOV. 9TH: Must notify College Office if they are using SUNY applications to apply to SUNY instead of using the Common Application

NOV. 11TH: Enter the schools with a 1/1/21 deadline on Naviance under 'schools I am applying to'

NOV. 18TH: Students enter the schools with a 1/15/21 deadline on Naviance under 'schools I am applying to'

DEC. 14TH: LAST DAY that you will be able to make changes to your listings on Naviance

DEC. 16TH: LAST DAY you will be able to add fee waiver requests

FAFSA

• **GO TO FAFSA.GOV**

- FSA ID: You must get a FSA ID for you and your parents as this is your electronic signature <https://fsaid.ed.gov>
- For security reasons, you will have to select 5 challenge questions and answers must be unique
- **Do not** use the same email address for you and your parent or your Baruch address
- **Use your personal email** because you will be using your email for 4 or more years
- List up to 10 colleges on FAFSA when you first apply and can add additional schools by correction
- Your college list will not be shared with colleges

CSS (COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP SERVICE)

- Only for certain private schools
- An additional application that is much more detailed and invasive
- May ask more questions about your family's financial circumstances
- If there is a divorce or separation in the family, you will have to complete a Non Custodial letter
- You can receive this letter from the College Office depending on your family circumstances
- **Application fee:** \$25.00 for the 1st school and \$16.00 for additional schools
- If you are entitled to a fee waiver, you will receive it automatically from the College Board based on the financial information that you put on the form

Program Details:

- **All courses will take place afterschool through distance learning from January 29th – May 25nd**

Eligibility:

- Students must be a current NYC public high school 11th or 12th grade
- Have the following test scores: PSAT/SAT Verbal (Min. 480) OR English Language Arts Regents (Min. 75), OR ACT English Score (Min. 20)
- Students who use PSAT scores to qualify for admission into the program, must have an overall GPA of 85

STEM RESEARCH ACADEMY



The STEM Research Academy is a two-semester program which allows high school students to take a pre-college science course to introduce them to the

expectations of working in a research lab. Upon successful completion of the course, students will be eligible to participate in a six week paid summer research experience with a Baruch College faculty member.

Program Details:

- **Spring 2021: Introduction to Research / DNA Detectives Course:** (End of January to May / Mon & Wed / 4:10pm-5:50pm). The objective of this course is to learn about the nature of DNA and genetic variation, deepen students' appreciation of biodiversity by providing opportunities for the students to develop, and practice sterile lab techniques, good record keeping habits, and proper measurement skills.
- **Summer 2021: Research Internship:** (July to August / Mon through Thurs). A six week paid structured laboratory internship where students will be matched with a Baruch College faculty member and lab team.

Eligibility:

- Be a current NYC public high school 11th grader
- Overall H.S. average of 80+
- 75 or above on the English Language Arts (ELA) Regents or 480+ on SAT Verbal/Critical Reading
- 80+ on any Math Regents Exam **AND** 75+ on the Living Environment Regents Exam
- 10th graders with an overall 80+ (overall average, English average, Math average, and Science average) will be considered
