## MID-YEAR REPORTS



Your Mid-Year Reports will be sent electronically to your schools listed on Naviance!!! The exception to this will be: **CUNY**, they do not require mid-year grades.

Also, if your school requires documents to be sent by mail, you must inform the College Office of this request.

**Questbridge** students must submit the Questbridge form that lists the schools they applied to, which lists how these schools require the documents to be submitted.


McGill and other schools may require you to upload your Mid Year Report, or have a link that the College Office should use to upload your Mid Year Report. It is your responsibility to notify the College Office of this.

## NAVIANCE



You must update your college decisions on your Naviance account by going to the **College tab** and then to **'Colleges I'm Applying to tab'**. By clicking on the pencil icon  you can then update the results of the colleges you applied to.

## FINANCIAL AID Q & A



### **1. I have selected that I would like to apply for EOP/ HEOP/ SEEK. How do I know if I am admitted?**

Make sure that you have completed your FAFSA and that all of your schools are listed on your FAFSA list. If you are accepted to that school, they will include further instructions on next steps to apply for these special programs.

### **2. FAFSA had us use our 2019 income taxes, but since then my family's financial situation has changed. 2019 taxes do not represent what my family's income is (change of employment, recent unemployment, death in the family, disability, etc.) What do I do?**

Schools understand that financial circumstances fluctuate from year to year. Under extreme circumstances, such as the ones listed above, you must call EVERY school you have applied to and speak to a financial aid officer representative. They will direct on what the next steps will be to take.

## UPCOMING SCHOLARSHIPS

**Jackie Robinson:**

**Due Feb. 1**

**Ascend Educational Fund:**

**Due Feb 5**

AEF will provide two-year or four-year college scholarships to promising immigrant students in New York City, who were either born outside the U.S. or have two parents born outside the U.S., in the range of \$2,500-\$20,000.

**The National Scholarship - For Dreamers:**

**Due Feb. 25**

The National Scholarship Award will cover your tuition and fees up to a maximum of \$16,500 for an associate degree and \$33,000 for a bachelor's degree, at one of our Partner Colleges. Please note, some Scholars may be eligible for an additional stipend of up to \$4,000 (or \$1,000 per year) for books, supplies, and transportation. The award is renewable each year – you simply have to meet the continuing eligibility criteria.

**Banyan Scholarship:**

**Due Feb 26**

**Amount:** \$2,000-5,000

Students must fulfill the following requirements to apply:

- Be of South Asian origin or descent (countries include India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and Nepal)
- Be a senior in high school in New York City

- Be a citizen, national or permanent resident of the U.S.
- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher
- Show annual family household income to be below \$75,000
- Have two letters of recommendation submitted on their behalf

**New York Water Environment Association, Inc.:**

**Due Feb 26 at 5PM**

\$12,000 Major Environmental Career Scholarship Application. To be eligible students must be a qualifying high school senior, a NY State resident, and intend to pursue a B.S. or B.E. degree program with an environmental emphasis.

**Nicholas J. Bartilucci Environmental Scholarship:**

**Due Feb 26 at 5PM**

The eligibility criteria for the \$6,000 scholarship (paid out in one lump sum) is as follows: The recipient must be: A qualifying high school senior A New York State resident Enrolled full-time in a B.S. or B.E. degree program with an emphasis on public service.

**Chin: Sui Kuen and Allen Chin Scholarship:**

**Due March 12**

- Grade level: Incoming freshman or current, full-time undergraduate at a four-year college or university in 2021-22
- Student or parent currently/formerly employed at an Asian-owned or Asian cuisine restaurant
- Any ethnic heritage
- Community advocacy and social justice work on behalf of Asian American, immigrant, gay and lesbian and/or other progressive causes
- Minimum GPA: 3.0
- Financial need

**Superpower Scholarship:**

**Due March 31**

Use your imagination and become a superhero, or perhaps supervillain, you've always wanted to be.

Would you live a life in a comic book universe or use your powers here in the real world? We want to know how you would use your super powers for good, or bad, even if it was just for the day. Submit an online short written response (250 words or less) for the question: "Which superhero or villain would you want to change places with for a day and why?"

**We the Students Essay Contest:**

**Due April 15**

What is the relationship between Equality and Justice?

Answering this question requires considering each of these principles and analyzing the relationship between them. To truly explore this question in an essay that is between 500 -800 words, you'll need to go beyond "dictionary definitions," and express your understanding and reasoning about the connection between these two principles. This reasoning involves a combination of observation, experience, and some pretty "big ideas." What does it take to understand them? To build toward and maintain them? To see them with regard to each other? Why is this relationship important? We encourage you to bring emotion, creativity, specific examples, and well-researched facts into what you write. A good essay will demonstrate how equality and justice are not just abstract ideas but are part of the actions and choices of people every day. We genuinely want to know how you would answer the question – what is the relationship between Equality and Justice?

**Milton Fisher Scholarship:**

**Due May 3**

Four year scholarship of up to \$20,000 for innovative and creative high school students from the NYC metro area.

Apply for this scholarship if you are . . .

- A student who has solved an artistic, scientific, or technical problem in a new or unusual way
- A student who has come up with a distinctive

solution to problems faced by your school, community or family

- A student who has created a new group, organization, or institution that serves an important need
